ON BEHALF OF THE BISMARCK POLICE DEPARTMENT, I PRESENT OUR 2023 ANNUAL REPORT. WE HAVE COMBINED THE 2023 ANNUAL REPORT WITH THE 2023 CRIME AND TRAFFIC ANALYSIS REPORT. WE ARE HOPING MORE PEOPLE WILL TAKE THE TIME TO READ THE REPORT AND THAT IT IS EASIER TO UNDERSTAND. WE WELCOME AND ENCOURAGE CONSTRUCTIVE FEEDBACK SO THAT WE CAN CONTINUE TO IMPROVE THIS REPORT AND GIVE OUR CITIZENS THE INFORMATION THEY WANT TO LEARN ABOUT THEIR POLICE DEPARTMENT.

AS I REVIEWED THE 2023 ANNUAL REPORT, I LEARNED PERSONAL CRIMES OVERALL WERE UP 0.08% AND PROPERTY CRIMES OVERALL WERE DOWN 2.06%.

ALTHOUGH PERSONAL CRIME IS UP COMPARED TO 2022, 2023 PERSONAL CRIME IS SLIGHTLY BELOW THE FIVE-YEAR AVERAGE OF 1,215 PERSONAL CRIMES PER YEAR. SEX OFFENSES AND INTIMIDATION OFFENSES ARE THE DRIVING FORCE IN THE RISE OF PERSONAL CRIME. THIS IS CONCERNING AND SOMETHING WE ARE ACTIVELY STUDYING TO SEE IF THERE ARE ACTIONS WE CAN TAKE TO HELP PREVENT/LESSEN THESE CRIMES.

IT IS NICE TO SEE THAT PROPERTY CRIME IS DOWN COMPARED TO 2022 AND THAT IT IS THE LOWEST IT HAS BEEN IN THE LAST FIVE YEARS. WE WILL BE STUDYING THIS AS WELL TO SEE IF THERE ARE THINGS WE ARE DOING THAT CAN HELP THIS TREND TO CONTINUE.

ONE THING I KNOW FOR SURE IS THAT OUR CITIZENS ARE A MAJOR FACTOR IN HELPING KEEP CRIME DOWN. WE VERY MUCH APPRECIATE THE PROACTIVE APPROACH OUR CITIZENS TAKE IN REPORTING ANY SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY THEY SEE TO US SO WE CAN INVESTIGATE. MOST OFTEN THE SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY IS INNOCENT BUT WHEN PEOPLE KNOW THEY ARE BEING WATCHED, THEY ARE MORE APT TO BEHAVE.

AFTER SEVERAL YEARS OF DRUG OVERDOSES AND OVERDOSE DEATHS NEARLY DOUBLING BEFORE LEVELING OFF BETWEEN 2021-2022, WE ACTUALLY SAW A DECREASE IN BOTH IN 2023. ALTHOUGH THIS IS GOOD NEWS AND I HOPE THIS TREND CONTINUES, WE KNOW THERE ARE MANY OVERDOSES THAT ARE NOT REPORTED TO US MOSTLY DUE TO AVAILABILITY OF NARCAN TO THE PUBLIC. THIS IS ALSO GOOD BUT IT IS ALSO DANGEROUS FOR OVERDOSE VICTIMS TO NOT SEEK TREATMENT AFTER OVERDOSING ON ANY SUBSTANCE.

AS ALWAYS, WE ARE VERY GRATEFUL FOR THE COMMUNITY SUPPORT WE RECEIVE. WE WILL CONTINUE TO WORK HARD TO EARN YOUR FAITH AND TRUST.




OUR ABILITY TO MAINTAIN THE PUBLIC'S TRUST AND COOPERATION IS THE CORNERSTONE OF OUR SUCCESS.

THE UNIFORMED MEMBERS OF THE PATROL SECTION ACTIVELY PATROL AND RESPOND TO CALLS FOR SERVICE THROUGHOUT THE CITY. 


TOTAL CALLS FOR SERVICE AND CRIMINAL ACTIVITY BY HOUR BLOCK 2023



CALLS FOR SERVICE BY BEAT AREA




2023 CALLS FOR SERVICE BY DAY OF WEEK



TOTAL POLICE RESPONSES GENERATED BY 911 CALLS FOR SERVICE




CRIMINAL ACTIVITY DAY VS. NIGHT SHIFT 2023



THE BISMARCK POLICE DEPARTMENT'S PATROL SECTION, REPORTING TO THE DEPUTY CHIEF OF THE FIELD SERVICES DIVISION, IS DIVIDED INTO TWO PATROL SHIFTS. EACH PATROL SHIFT IS LED BY A LIEUTENANT. IN ADDITION TO THE LIEUTENANTS, EACH SHIFT IS ASSIGNED SIX SERGEANTS AND APPROXIMATELY THIRTY POLICE OFFICERS. OUR PATROL SECTION IS RESPONSIBLE FOR INITIAL POLICE RESPONSE, PROACTIVE CRIMINAL AND TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT, WITH A FOCUS ON FIGHTING CRIME, COLLABORATIVE PROBLEM SOLVING, COMMUNITY POLICING INITIATIVES, BUILDING RELATIONSHIPS WITHIN OUR COMMUNITY, AND RESPONSE TO SIGNIFICANT OR EMERGING ISSUES. THE COLLABORATIVE EFFORTS BETWEEN OUR PATROL OFFICERS, AND THE OTHER SECTIONS WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT, AS WELL AS WITH OUR OUTSIDE LAW ENFORCEMENT, AND COMMUNITY PARTNERS, HAVE RESULTED IN SOME EXCELLENT POLICE WORK.

THE PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITY OF THE TRAFFIC SECTION IS ROADWAY SAFETY. WE WORK WITH SEVERAL OTHER DEPARTMENTS AND AGENCIES TO REDUCE INJURY AND DEATH. THE TRAFFIC SECTION OFFICERS RECEIVE ADVANCED TRAINING IN COLLISION INVESTIGATION WITH THE TRAFFIC SERGEANT AND TWO OFFICERS TRAINED AS COLLISION RECONSTRUCTION EXPERTS. WE USE CURRENT TECHNOLOGY TO AID IN OUR DUTIES. THE TRAFFIC SECTION IS RESPONSIBLE FOR ANYTHING "TRAFFIC" RELATED CONDUCTING SPECIAL ENFORCEMENT OF AREAS OF PUBLIC CONCERN.

TRAFFIC CITATIONS ISSUED 2019-2023







THE PARKING ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS HAVE RESPONSIBILITY FOR PARKING VIOLATIONS, ASSISTING WITH TRAFFIC CONTROL AND THE REMOVAL OF ABANDONED VEHICLES. THE ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICERS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE CARE OF IMPOUNDED ANIMALS AND ASSIST IN INVESTIGATIONS OF ANIMAL NEGLECT AND CRUELTY.

THE CRIMINAL INVESTIGATION SECTION FALLS WITHIN THE FIELD SERVICES DIVISION OF THE BISMARCK POLICE DEPARTMENT. THE SECTION IS COMPRISED OF THE FOLLOWING: 1-LIEUTENANT, 3-SERGEANTS, 1-OFFICE ASSISTANT, 10-INVESTIGATORS, 7- NARCOTIC INVESTIGATORS, 1 FORENSIC ELECTRONIC INVESTIGATOR/SEX OFFENDER COMPLIANCE, 2- WARRANTS OFFICERS, 1-INTEL ANALYST AND 1-INTEL OFFICER.

THE DETECTIVES/OFFICERS ASSIGNED TO THE INVESTIGATION SECTION ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR CONDUCTING THOROUGH INVESTIGATIONS BY INTERVIEWING VICTIMS, WITNESSES, SUSPECTS AND PROCESSING CRIME SCENES, PRESERVING EVIDENCE, AND COMPLETING CASE FILES FOR PROSECUTION. THE INVESTIGATION SECTION INCLUDES PERSONAL CRIMES, PROPERTY CRIMES, NARCOTIC CRIMES AND THE WARRANTS DIVISION.

THE CRIME PREVENTION AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT SECTION IS STAFFED BY OFFICER CLINT FULLER AND OFFICER CAITLIN HORNE. IT IS SUPERVISED BY SGT. DUSTIN MILLER AND OVERSEEN BY LT. MIKE McMERTY.

THE FOCUS OF OUR COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT ENDEAVORS IS FOSTERING A POSITIVE RELATIONSHIP AND CONNECTING US WITH ALL MEMBERS OF THE COMMUNITY. WE WORK TO BUILD TRUST AND PARTNERSHIPS WITH THE COMMUNITY BY ENSURING INTEGRITY AND TRANSPARENCY IN ALL WE DO. OUR PROGRAMS, SUCH AS BUSINESS WATCH, THE CITIZEN POLICE ACADEMY, THE COMMUNITY PICNIC, AND COFFEE WITH A COP, ARE MEANT TO PROVIDE EDUCATION AND UNDERSTANDING OF OUR ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES IN AND AS MEMBERS OF THE COMMUNITY. THEY PROVIDE A CONDUIT FOR THE COMMUNITY TO LEARN ABOUT US WHILE WE, AT THE SAME TIME, LEARN ABOUT THE NEEDS AND PERCEPTIONS OF THE PUBLIC WE SERVE. THEY ADDRESS COMMUNITY SAFETY AND CRIME PREVENTION ISSUES FOR OUR SCHOOLS, HOMES, PLACES OF WORSHIP AND WORKPLACES. EXAMPLES OF THESE PRESENTATIONS ARE BICYCLE SAFETY, STRANGER DANGER, PERSONAL SAFETY, WORKPLACE VIOLENCE/ACTIVE SHOOTER AWARENESS AND SCAMS. OUR AUDIENCES RANGE FROM PRE-SCHOOL TO ADULTS. THE CRIME PREVENTION SECTION ALSO ADMINISTERS THE BUSINESS WATCH PROGRAM. WE PROVIDE PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENTS ON VARIOUS SEASONAL AND RECURRING TOPICS SUCH AS VEHICLE THEFT PREVENTION, HALLOWEEN SAFETY AND WINTER DRIVING TIPS. THE SECTION ALSO PROVIDES SECURITY SURVEYS FOR BUSINESSES, CHURCHES AND HOMEOWNERS. THESE SURVEYS ARE CONDUCTED BY TRAINED OFFICERS WHO WILL ASSESS HOMES OR WORKPLACES FOR SAFETY AND SECURITY DEFICIENCIES. THEY WILL PROVIDE SUGGESTIONS ON HOW TO IMPROVE SAFETY AND SECURITY ON YOUR PROPERTIES AND FOR THOSE WHO WORK OR LIVE THERE.

THE RECORDS SECTION SERVES AS THE CENTRAL REPOSITORY FOR ALL INCIDENTS, ACCIDENTS AND ALL OTHER ASSOCIATED DOCUMENTS GENERATED BY BISMARCK POLICE DEPARTMENT OFFICERS. IT IS COMPRISED OF A CIVILIAN SUPERVISOR AND SEVEN RECORDS/RECEPTION STAFF. RECEPTION DEALS WITH ALL INCOMING CALLS, WALK IN TRAFFIC AND ALL OTHER REQUESTS. THESE RECORDS ALLOW DEPARTMENT EMPLOYEES AND OTHER GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES ACCESS TO CRITICAL INFORMATION FOR INVESTIGATORS, OFFICERS, ADMINISTRATORS, PROSECUTORS AND THE PUBLIC. THE RECORDS SECTION COMPLETES BACKGROUND CHECKS FOR GAMING, TAXI, AND DOOR TO DOOR PERMITS, LIQUOR LICENSES, AND THE PUBLIC OR OTHER AGENCIES. THIS SECTION ALSO UPDATES THE SEX OFFENDER INFORMATION WHEN THE OFFENDER COMES IN TO REGISTER.

RECORDS AND RECEPTION

THE BISMARCK POLICE DEPARTMENT PARTICIPATES IN A NATIONAL ACCREDITATION PROCESS THROUGH THE COMMISSION ON ACCREDITATION FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES (CALEA), WHICH IS THOUGHT TO BE THE GOLD STANDARD IN PUBLIC SAFETY. IT CREATES A FORUM IN WHICH LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES AND CITIZENS WORK TOGETHER TO PREVENT AND CONTROL CHALLENGES CONFRONTING LAW ENFORCEMENT AND PROVIDES CLEAR DIRECTION ABOUT COMMUNITY EXPECTATIONS.

BPD HAS BEEN ACCREDITED SINCE 1991 AND WE ARE CURRENTLY IN OUR 11TH ACCREDITATION CYCLE AND PARTICIPATING IN THE ADVANCED LAW ENFORCEMENT ACCREDITATION PROCESS.

CALEA REVIEWS STANDARDS ANNUALLY AND WE CURRENTLY HAVE A PORTAL AVAILABLE FOR CONCERNS THAT ARE ALSO REVIEWED.

THE BISMARCK POLICE DEPARTMENT FLEET VEHICLES ARE ASSIGNED AND CATEGORIZED INTO THE FOLLOWING EIGHT DIVISIONS; PATROL, TRAFFIC, DETECTIVES, POLICE YOUTH BUREAU (PYB), ADMINISTRATION, AIRPORT, AND SPECIAL OPERATIONS. THE FOLLOWING IS A DETAILED BREAKDOWN OF THE FLEET ASSIGNMENTS WITHIN THE BISMARCK POLICE DEPARTMENT:

- 🚓 POLICE YOUTH BUREAU (PYB)/SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER (SRO) - 11 VEHICLES CONSISTING OF EIGHT MARKED PATROL VEHICLES, ONE UNMARKED ADMINISTRATIVE VEHICLE, AND TWO VANS
- 🚓 ADMINISTRATION - 8 VEHICLES ASSIGNED TO ADMINISTRATION, CRIME PREVENTION, MAINTENANCE, FLEET, AND TRAINING.
- 🚓 SPECIAL OPERATIONS - 9 SPECIALIZED VEHICLES ALLOCATED TO THE SPECIAL OPERATIONS DIVISIONS OF THE WEST DAKOTA SWAT TEAM, BOMB SQUAD, AND HOSTAGE NEGOTIATION TEAM.

DECOMMISSIONED: IN 2023 THERE WERE (13) VEHICLES DECOMMISSIONED THROUGH THE AUCTION PROCESS, TRANSFERRED TO OTHER DEPARTMENTS, LEASE RETURNS, OR REPLACED DUE TO DEPARTMENT'S MOTOR VEHICLE CRASH LOSS. ALL FUNDS GENERATED FROM THE SALE OF POLICE VEHICLES, UNLESS ORIGINALLY PURCHASED FROM THE DRUG ASSET FORFEITURE FUND, GOES TO THE CITY GENERAL FUND.

UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF LT. MIKE McMERTY AND SGT. DUSTIN MILLER, EVIDENCE TECHNICIANS BRITTNEY RAMBOUSEK AND AMBER HANOANO ARE TASKED WITH MAINTAINING THE EVIDENTIARY CHAIN OF CUSTODY AND INTEGRITY OF EVIDENCE AND PROPERTY. EVIDENCE TECHNICIAN RESPONSIBILITIES ROUTINELY INCLUDE RECEIVING, RECORDING, ACCOUNTING FOR, STORING, AND RELEASING OF EVIDENCE, AS WELL AS FOUND AND ABANDONED PROPERTY.

IN 2023, THE EVIDENCE SECTION RECEIVED INTO ITS CUSTODY 11,214 TOTAL ITEMS WHICH CONSISTED OF:

- 1,247 DRUGS
- 2,185 DRUG PARAPHERNALIA
- 147 FIREARMS

THE FACILITY MAINTENANCE SECTION IS UNDER THE SUPPORT SERVICES DIVISION OF THE BISMARCK POLICE DEPARTMENT. THE MAINTENANCE STAFF IS COMPRISED OF ONE POLICE MAINTENANCE TECHNICIAN, AND TWO BUILDING SERVICE WORKERS. THE STAFF IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE PREVENTIVE MAINTENANCE, MINOR CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS, REORGANIZATION AND GENERAL CLEANING/UPKEEP OF THE SIX (6) BISMARCK POLICE DEPARTMENT FACILITIES.

IN ADDITION TO THEIR DAY-TO-DAY FUNCTIONS, THE FACILITY MAINTENANCE SECTION DEALT WITH ALMOST A RECORD-BREAKING YEAR OF SNOW FALL KEEPING ALL FACILITIES CLEARED OF SNOW AND ALSO ASSISTED WITH THE NEW INSTALL OF THE AXON SYSTEM FOR BODY CAMS AND INTERNAL CAMERAS AT THE BISMARCK POLICE DEPARTMENT BUILDING.

THIS YEAR AS IN LAST YEARS, MAINTENANCE WAS TASKED WITH ADDITIONAL RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE GENERAL CLEANING AND SANITIZING OF THE MULTIPLE BUILDINGS DUE TO COVID-19.

THE MISSION OF THE WEST DAKOTA SWAT TEAM IS TO SUPPORT PUBLIC SAFETY ENTITIES WITH A TECHNICALLY AND TACTICALLY PROFICIENT SPECIAL OPERATIONS TEAM. A TEAM CAPABLE OF RESPONDING TO CRITICAL INCIDENTS AND COMMUNITY PROBLEMS THAT ARE BEST RESOLVED BY THE APPLICATION OF ADVANCED TACTICAL METHODS. THE ULTIMATE GOAL IS TO RESOLVE THESE CRITICAL INCIDENTS WITH NO LOSS OF LIFE OR INJURY TO OFFICERS, INNOCENT PERSONS, AND SUSPECTS.

THE WEST DAKOTA SWAT TEAM/CRISIS NEGOTIATIONS TEAM IS A MULTI-AGENCY REGIONAL TEAM THAT INCLUDES THE BISMARCK POLICE DEPARTMENT, MANDAN POLICE DEPARTMENT, BURLEIGH COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT AND THE MORTON COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE. THE RESPONSE AREA FOR THE TEAM IS LOCATED IN THE SOUTH-CENTRAL REGION OF NORTH DAKOTA AND INCLUDES BURLEIGH, MORTON, GRANT, EMMONS, MCINTOSH, LOGAN, KIDDER, MCLEAN, WELLS AND SHERIDAN COUNTIES.

THE WEST DAKOTA SWAT TEAM OPERATES UNDER THE CONTROL OF AND REPORTS TO AN EXECUTIVE BOARD, WHICH IS COMPRISED OF THE DEPARTMENT HEAD FROM THE FOUR PARTICIPATING AGENCIES. THE EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETS SEMI-ANNUALLY TO REVIEW ACTIVATIONS, TRAINING, PERSONNEL, EQUIPMENT, AND BUDGET ITEMS.



THE TEAM IS COMPRISED OF THIRTY-TWO TACTICAL OFFICERS, A TACTICAL MEDIC, AND ELEVEN NEGOTIATORS. THE RANK STRUCTURE OF THE TEAM CONSISTS OF A COMMANDER, ASSISTANT COMMANDERS, TEAM LEADERS, ASSISTANT TEAM LEADERS, TACTICAL OPERATORS, NEGOTIATORS, AND MARKSMAN. THE WEST DAKOTA SWAT TEAM IS A COLLATERAL DUTY TEAM, WHICH MEANS ALL MEMBERS HAVE OTHER PRIMARY ASSIGNMENTS WITHIN THEIR RESPECTIVE AGENCIES.

A HIGH PERCENTAGE OF INCIDENTS FOR WHICH THE WEST DAKOTA SWAT TEAM IS ACTIVATED INVOLVE ARMED BARRICADED SUBJECTS WHO HAVE COMMITTED A SERIOUS CRIMINAL OFFENSE. THE TEAM ALSO RESPONDS TO HOSTAGE RESCUE SITUATIONS, HIGH RISK WARRANT SERVICE, HIGH RISK SUSPECT APPREHENSION, DIGNITARY PROTECTION, AND TERRORISM RESPONSE.

BISMARCK POLICE DEPARTMENT BOMB SQUAD IS A REGIONAL RESPONSE TEAM THAT RESPONDS TO THE SOUTHWESTERN PART OF NORTH DAKOTA WHICH INCLUDES COORDINATION WITH 18 DIFFERENT COUNTIES INVOLVING 37 SEPARATE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES.



OUR PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES INCLUDE:

- RESPONDING TO BOMB THREAT EMERGENCIES
- COORDINATING AREA SEARCHES FOR EXPLOSIVE DEVICES
- EXAMINATION & DISPOSAL OF SUSPICIOUS BAGS/PACKAGES
- RECOVERY & RENDER SAFE PROCEDURES OF IMPROVISED EXPLOSIVE DEVICES (IED) RECOVERY & DISPOSAL OF COMMERCIAL EXPLOSIVES, MILITARY ORDINANCES, & DANGEROUS CHEMICALS
- RESPONDING TO INCIDENTS INVOLVING EXPLOSIVE, CHEMICAL, BIOLOGICAL, RADIOLOGICAL, AND NUCLEAR THREATS, & ALL OTHER WEAPONS OF MASS DESTRUCTION
- POST BLAST INVESTIGATIONS TO INCLUDE EVIDENCE COLLECTION, PROCESSING & ANALYSIS, AND INTERVIEWING VICTIMS, WITNESSES, & SUSPECTS
- SUPPORT WEST DAKOTA SWAT WITH TACTICAL EVENTS UTILIZING THE ROBOTS AND EXPLOSIVE BREACHING

IN 2023 THE BOMB SQUAD RESPONDED TO 10 CALLS FOR SERVICE INVOLVING PIPE BOMBS, SUSPICIOUS BAGS/PACKAGES, HOMEMADE EXPLOSIVES (HME), FIREWORKS, MILITARY ORDINANCE, AND HAZMAT CALLS. THESE CALLS CONSISTED OF BOTH FAKE AND LIVE DEVICES. THE BOMB SQUAD ROUTINELY ASSISTS THE WEST DAKOTA SWAT WITH CALLOUTS WITH OUR ROBOTS. WE CONTINUE TO CONDUCT JOINT TRAINING WITH STATE AND LOCAL AGENCIES ACROSS THE STATE TO ASSIST THEM IN RESPONDING TO BOMB THREATS AND SUSPICIOUS PACKAGES.

FOUR SECURITY SWEEPS WERE CONDUCTED FOR BOTH THE EVENT CENTER AND THE STATE OF THE STATE ADDRESS.

ONE NEW TECH WAS ADDED IN 2023 AND THE ROBOT WAS UPGRADED.

THE BOMB SQUAD HAS AN EXCELLENT SAFETY RECORD AND EACH OF THESE RESPONSES WAS COMPLETED WITHOUT ANY INJURY TO THE OFFICERS OR THE PUBLIC.

BISMARCK POLICE DEPARTMENT

THE K-9 UNIT CONSISTS OF FOUR DUAL-PURPOSE K9S AND THEIR RESPECTIVE HANDLERS. THE K-9S ARE NATIONALLY CERTIFIED TO PERFORM PATROL AND NARCOTICS DETECTION. IN 2024, THE DEPARTMENT WILL BE ADDING A FIFTH K-9 TEAM. THE K-9 TEAMS ARE UTILIZED THROUGHOUT THE CITY AS A FORCE MULTIPLIER IN ASSISTING OFFICERS WITH VARIOUS TASKS. THE K-9S ARE ROUTINELY USED FOR DEPLOYMENTS RELATED TO DRUG DETECTION, TRACKING SUSPECTS, SEARCHING BUILDINGS, LOCATING EVIDENCE AND SUSPECT APPREHENSION.



IN 2023, THE K-9 UNIT HAD 412 DEPLOYMENTS. THE UNIT ALSO VALUES PUBLIC DEMONSTRATIONS AND WORKING WITH THE DEPARTMENT'S SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS TO ASSIST WITH SCHOOL SEARCHES TO AID IN DETERRING DRUG USAGE WITHIN THE SCHOOLS. THE K-9 PROGRAM STARTED IN 1976.



CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:
ALL BISMARCK POLICE K-9 TEAMS ARE CERTIFIED AT A MINIMUM ON AN ANNUAL BASIS THROUGH A NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED ORGANIZATION: NATIONAL POLICE CANINE ASSOCIATION (NPCA), UNITED STATES POLICE CANINE ASSOCIATION (USPCA), NORTH AMERICAN POLICE WORK DOG ASSOCIATION (NAPWDA), OR SIMILAR ORGANIZATION TO ENSURE THE TEAM'S OPERATIONAL READINESS.



MONTHLY TRAINING:
A MINIMUM OF TWO TRAINING DAYS ARE SCHEDULED EACH MONTH TO ENSURE THAT HANDLERS MEET THE K-9 INDUSTRY STANDARD OF A MINIMUM OF 16 HOURS OF TRAINING PER MONTH.

WARDZINSKI ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE TRAINING AND PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT OF THE OFFICERS. THEY ARE COMMITTED TO PROVIDING THE OFFICERS WITH THE VERY BEST TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES AVAILABLE IN ORDER THEY CAN PERFORM THEIR DUTIES IN THE SAFEST AND EFFICIENT MANNER WHILE PROVIDING THE VERY BEST SERVICE TO THE PUBLIC.

THE TRAINING RANGED FROM BASIC RECRUIT TRAINING TOPICS TO ADVANCED TOPICS SUCH AS, CRIMINAL & ADVANCED INTERVIEW & INTERROGATION, LAW ENFORCEMENT ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT, INTERNAL AFFAIRS INVESTIGATIONS, AND ADVANCED TRAFFIC CRASH INVESTIGATIONS.

THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA REQUIRES THAT EACH SWORN OFFICER MUST RECEIVE A MINIMUM OF 60 HOURS OF TRAINING EVERY THREE YEARS IN ORDER TO MAINTAIN THEIR LAW ENFORCEMENT CERTIFICATION. THE BISMARCK POLICE DEPARTMENT'S OFFICERS AVERAGED APPROXIMATELY 107 HOURS TRAINING EACH FOR 2023 ALONE. THE TOTAL NUMBER OF TRAINING HOURS RECEIVED BY OUR OFFICERS IN 2023 WAS OVER 13,740 HOURS. OUR DEPARTMENT'S CIVILIAN STAFF AVERAGED APPROXIMATELY 15 HOURS OF TRAINING EACH FOR 2023. THE TOTAL NUMBER OF TRAINING HOURS RECEIVED BY OUR CIVILIAN STAFF IN 2023 WAS 420 HOURS.

THE DEPARTMENT'S TRAINING SECTION WAS ALSO RESPONSIBLE FOR THE TRAINING OF FOURTEEN RECRUIT OFFICERS. ADDITIONALLY, IT WAS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE COORDINATION OF SPECIALIZED TRAINING FOR DEPARTMENTAL PERSONNEL AND FOR ENSURING THAT ALL SWORN PERSONNEL MET ND POST, BISMARCK POLICE DEPARTMENT, AND CALEA ANNUAL IN-SERVICE TRAINING REQUIREMENTS.

THE BISMARCK MOUNTED POLICE SERVE AS AN AUXILIARY COMPONENT OF THE BISMARCK POLICE DEPARTMENT. THEY AND THEIR HORSES ARE TRAINED IN EQUINE SCENTING SEARCH AND RESCUE AND CAN BE ACTIVATED TO ASSIST WHEN NEEDED BY ANY LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY IN THE STATE. THE MOUNTED POLICE AND THEIR HORSES PARTICIPATE IN SEVERAL EVENTS THROUGHOUT THE STATE TO HELP PROMOTE THE POSITIVE IMAGE OF NORTH DAKOTA LAW ENFORCEMENT AND COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT.



IN 2023, MEMBERS OF THE UNIT ATTENDED THREE COMMUNITY EVENTS. 1ST LT. JEANETTE HOFFMAN, PAST CAPTAIN TERRI SCHONERT AND CAPTAIN GOLDSACK ALONG WITH THEIR HORSES ATTENDED THE TRI-CITY COMMUNITY PICNIC AND PARTICIPATED IN THE MANDAN FOURTH OF JULY PARADE. CAPTAIN GOLDSACK AND 1ST LT. HOFFMAN AND THEIR HORSES REPRESENTED THE MOUNTED POLICE AT THE BACK THE BLUE EVENT. DUE TO THE WEATHER, SCHEDULED EVENTS SUCH AS THE LINCOLN PTO HALLOWEEN TRUNK OR TREAT EVENT WAS CANCELLED AND THE LAW ENFORCEMENT TRUNK OR TREAT AT THE LAW ENFORCEMENT TRAINING ACADEMY AND THE BISMARCK POLICE DEPARTMENT TRUNK OR TREAT WERE MOVED INDOORS, SO THE UNIT AND THEIR HORSES WERE NOT ABLE TO PARTICIPATE.

THE MOUNTED POLICE UNIT IS ALWAYS LOOKING TO GROW THEIR MEMBERSHIP TO CREATE AN EVEN STRONGER ORGANIZATION. THEIR GOAL IS TO CREATE A STRONGER MEMBERSHIP BASE, TO BETTER SUPPORT THEIR ABILITY TO PARTICIPATE IN PARADES AND OTHER PERFORMANCE REQUESTS AND TO INCREASE THEIR SEARCH AND RESCUE CAPABILITIES.
